This month we look at another lady aviator from between the wars

The Flying Duchess By John Simpson- Mary Russell was also known as the Duchess of Bedford and lived in Scotland and later Woburn in England. She was born Mary Du Gaurroy Tribe, daughter of an Archdeacon. She married Lord Herbrand Russell in 1880, who inherited the Dukedom of Bedford in 1891. Mary was born at Stocksbridge in Hampshire on 28th September 1865 and educated at Cheltenham Ladies College. After a medical career and fighting for women's rights she took up flying at aged sixty, making her first flight from Croydon to Woburn on June 17th 1926. Flying then became a passion for her and often flew in tandem with a pilot around England and Scotland in a De Havilland DH 60 Moth. This also extended to France, Italy and Spain. At this time of life she had hearing problems, so this was a brave choice.

In 1928 she came to Lympe to make a long distance flight to Karachi then in India, in her own aeroplane called *Princess Xenia*. After reaching Bushire in Persia (now Iran), her aeroplane piloted by Charles Barnard and Eric Alliot took off for Karachi, but suffered engine failure ten minutes into the flight. A replacement engine was shipped out on SS Shariston so they could complete the flight. The Duchess then returned by boat whilst Barnard and Alliot flew back to Croydon in the repaired aircraft. Undaunted she took off again from Lympe at 5am on Friday August 2nd in her Fokker FV11A G-EBTS, the same aircraft now called *Spider*. At the controls were Cpt. Charles Barnard and Robert F. Little.

The take off was not a good one as they had a narrow escape, with an attendant ambulance driver jumping into his cab to race after them, but wasn't needed. This time the 64 year old Duchess who liked to take the controls herself, made a successful flight via Sofia in Bulgaria (1400miles), Aleppo in Syria (900), Bushire in Persia (1000) and the remaining 1050 miles to Karachi on the 5th of August. The next day the same crew made the return flight via the same route to Croydon flying over Lympe and landing at 5.40pm. This was a record breaking flight at the time. The Duchess became a fully qualified pilot herself on the 8th April 1930. Two days later she took off from Lympe for Cape Town with Charles Barnard and Robert Little, covering 9000 miles in 91 days, another record. En route an oil line failed and they had to stop at Sofia to have it sorted out. Later they discovered that the aeroplane had been shot at from the ground whilst over the Sahara Desert upon ground inspection of the airframe. In 1934 and 1935, Mary flew several flights with F/Lt. Preston in a De Havilland Puss Moth, G-ABOC to the Western Sahara and northern Nigeria.

Finally her luck ran out, as on March 22nd 1937, with just over 199 hours logged, she took off in a DH Gipsy Moth to bring her hours over the 200 hours mark, she disappeared over the North Sea. At first it wasn't clear where she had come down, but when struts from the aircraft were washed up at Great Yarmouth, Gorleston, Lowestoft and Southwold on the East Anglian coast, it was clear she had gone down in the sea. Her body was never found. She was 71 years old.

STUDYING HISTORY AND ARCHAEOLOGY IN LYMPNE (SHAL)

Following the brief April AGM covering its reports, SHAL Committee member, Mike Pearson, gave a talk on the 1998/9 excavation by Oxford Archaeology of Westhawk Farm, Ashford, listed as a small town because of its size (50 acres) and its importance to the Romans in Kent in supplying smelted iron to the Weald for armoury for its troops. The excavation revealed a main road running through the site to outside its northern boundary where roads led to Canterbury and the Weald, with nearby roads to Maidstone and Lympe. The iron ore it received was smelted in furnaces on the site and then initial smithing converted it into trade iron (ingots). The main road was flanked by properties at right angles on both sides, with the SE side predominantly for agriculture and the SW side for domestic activity and crop processing. Towards the N end was a religious/ritual centre with a shrine and just below it was a village green for outdoor gatherings. The cemetery was outside the NW site boundary which had a number of cremation urns one of which contained an armlet and a necklace both made of black jet beads.. Westhawk's existence began in the second century (C2) and lasted until the end of C3, as the demand for iron declined as the Roman forces began to be overrun abroad, particularly in Gaul. Nevertheless the layout and organisation of the site has been described as better than any other similar site in Roman Britain.

Our next event on Tuesday 18 May is a daytime visit to both the Bronze Age boat and the Painted House in Dover.

KENT GARDENER- By now the garden has a real energy about it with most flowers and vegetables putting on spurts of growth as the days become warmer. Beware of late night time frosts when planting out half-hardy bedding and crops and have some garden fleece or old net curtains handy to throw over. But be sure to harden them off first to acclimatise them to the change in temperatures. While renewing the borders look out for those plants needing staking and those cheeky weeds taking advantage. Towards the end of the month some late flowering perennials can be given the 'Chelsea Chop'. These are the taller sedums, phlox and dahlias which produce side shoots. Cut some of the stems down by a third to just above a leaf node. This makes the plant bushier and flower a little later, but it will prolong it into the autumn. This is not suitable for delphiniums, campanula or sunflowers which do not have side shoots. It is not too late to sow some seeds for follow on crops, winter vegetables or biennial flowers like hollyhock or sweet William which form leaves in the first year and flower the next. Don't forget to grow some for the bees, butterflies and moths. Nicotiana, evening primrose and some honeysuckles are good food sources for moths. Now is a good time to start youngsters on the path to gardening. Give them a sunny spot or container and let them choose what to grow, perhaps quick crops like radish, round carrots or lettuce which they can sow, water, watch develop and perhaps eat. Messy but fun. Happy Gardening.

Lympne Fellowship- We spent an interesting afternoon in May sharing Hints and Tips about such things as:

- Bicarbonate of soda - make a paste with water and use for spot-cleaning of carpets
- Add bicarb to a reduced amount of liquid detergent in the washing machine
- White vinegar - many cleaning uses, including around taps, in kettles, a cupful in the dishwasher to clean it, and, of course, for sparkling windows
- Washing soda crystals (not bicarb), in solution, for cleaning mossy steps and for drains
- Cooking gadgets, to avoid using an almost-empty oven: slow cookers and air-fryers, plus a special recommendation for soup-makers.
- Air-fryers for those who have acquired one - many recommendations, but be prepared for some trial and error at first. Especially good for baked potatoes, frozen chips, meat, frozen croissants and part-baked rolls.

www.beverleyjarvis.co.uk has some practical guidance and recipes. Many other websites are available, of course. Food For Free by Richard Mabey - a useful book for those who like to forage. Rosemary told us about wild garlic leaves being used with spinach; also Alexanders, the tall, green-flowered plant which pops up just about everywhere locally, has a stem which can be cooked like asparagus. 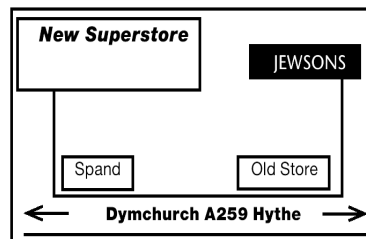

GO AHEAD GIVEN FOR THE OTTERPOOL GARDEN TOWN

The District Council Website states that “A new beautifully designed garden town is set to be created in the heart of the Kent countryside after outline planning permission was granted last night (4 April).” Well on paper it does look very pretty and the aspirations of the District Council sold in glossy publications and well worded speeches seem to paint a eutopia. Only the future will prove this right. In the meantime Lympne Parish Council along with adjoining Parishes carried on pushing their objections to the development siting issues with infrastructure including water supplies, highways, increased traffic and concerns over health care and transport not to mention the loss of agricultural land and local identity. Cllr Mike Boor attended the planning Committee meeting where a majority of the District Council supported the outline planning application. Mike expressed concerns raised by our residents over the years and made significant points regarding the timing of the committee meeting, just one month before the elections where potentially there could be a change in views on this plan. He also highlighted that this was an outline planning application with all matters reserved, meaning that further applications would need approval before anything could be built and in his words meant that any “awkward issues could be just kicked down the road”. With concerns over selling the development onto a private owner he raised that in order for this to be designated as a Garden Town its stewardship should be in the hands of the Local Authority with the community being their prime

motivation when developing the area. A private developers motivation would be profit. He then gave a warning to the committee that before they approved the application they should understand that they can not sell on the project because of its designation as a Garden Town. He finished his three minute allotted time stating that far from this becoming a utopian idyll it will end up “becoming a financial and mental stress millstone around the necks of Folkestone and Hythe residents for decades to come”. Other speakers including Damian Collins MP supported the application. The Chair of the Otterpool LLP explained how the development will include 22% affordable homes, green spaces, cultural and communal areas and encouragement for cycling and walking. The Parish Council will continue to scrutinise each application as it comes forward on your behalf and as always your comments for or against each one would be very much welcomed to assist the decision making
